ManTech Wins USDA BPA and First Two Task Orders to Provide Cyber Security Services

FAIRFAX, Virginia, August 25, 2009-- ManTech International Corporation (Nasdaq:MANT) announced today that it is one of six companies awarded a blanket purchase agreement (BPA) from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to provide cyber security support. The BPA has a one-year base period, four one-year options and an initial ceiling value of \$30 million for all six firms.

ManTech was also recently awarded its first two task orders under this BPA. The first, to provide a vulnerability assessment of several USDA applications, is valued at \$41,000. The second is a four-year contract to provide computer forensic support to the Agriculture Security Operations Center valued at \$1.3 million.

ManTech will continue to compete to assist the USDA in implementing new cyber security measures to ensure the proactive protection and security of its networks, applications and hardware. These measures will include identifying security vulnerabilities, responding to attacks against agency resources and implementing corrective action accordingly.
